PERFORMANCE GAP/ ACTIVITY NEED: HPV related cancer is increasingly frequent in head and neck oncologic care. This disease should be recognized as a separate entity from HVP-negative cancers, specifically in the workup and management of HPV related cancer [Walgama, personal communication, 10/14/21).

DESIRED OUTCOMES: At the end of the activity, attendees will be able to:

- describe the relationship between HPV infection, vaccination, and development of malignancy.
- evaluate clinical trials in HPV head and neck cancers.
- discuss prevention strategies and the importance of multidisciplinary care of HPV related cancer.
