PERFORMANCE GAP/ ACTIVITY NEED: California AB2260, Bleeding Control Kit Legislation, became effective 1/1/23. It currently affects newly constructed buildings and may expand to existing buildings. It requires building managers to have 6 trauma kits available, stored next to an AED, and to replace components as used [Source: DMoore, MD, MParsons 2/7/23, personal communication). With recent deadly shootings in California, we are reminded of the importance of being able to assist ourselves and fellow victims during a public emergency that involves hemorrhage. Since first responders may not arrive on the scene immediately, it is important to know simple techniques for saving a life. Like CPR, the simple rationale and techniques for the Stop the Bleed concept can be invaluable and applied by anyone.

DESIRED OUTCOMES: At the end of the activity, attendees will be able to:

- explain the foundation of the Stop the Bleed course.
- recognize and assess life-threatening hemorrhage.
- discuss techniques of Stop the Bleed.
- share concepts and techniques of Stop the Bleed with friends and family.
